



Academic record control implies mid-term tests, final pass/fail tests and exam session.

Admission

To get nominated:

Student should contact International Team of his or her university to get a confirmation of Academic Exchange Agreement in effect between this university and FinU. FinU partner universities list can be found here:

Coordinator from partner university makes the nomination by sending an official letter to FinU International Team, mentioning student's details and preferred study period.

Nomination Deadlines:

May 1 – for Fall semester

November 1 – for Spring semester



Admission Documents Set

As the confirmation of nomination comes, a student should get the following docs in his online admission set:



signed application form to get admission at FinU

scanned copy of a passport, expiration date no less than 18 months starting from the Study Visa date of issue



application CV

certificate of language proficiency level (FinU programs are delivered fully in Russian or English, or mixed)

academic transcript to certify the mid-term academic results at home university

draft version of individual study plan

photo of applicant (.jpeg format)

Application Deadlines:

May 15 – for Fall semester

November 15 – for Spring semester

Visa Recommendations:

Coordinator at FinU e-mails the applicant an Official Invitation Letter for Entering the Russian Federation. The Invitation is to be presented to the Consular Department in the city mentioned in his application form and invitation itself. The Invitation should be accompanied with all necessary visa application documents. It is important to apply for a STUDY VISA ONLY! A visa is to be issued for 90 days of validity and is to be extended while student's stay in Russia.



Immigration Requirements & Travel Hints

You may have time and opportunity to explore other Russian cities and sites, so please keep in mind the following:

1.	According to Federal Law you must fill in the migration Form upon arrival
2.	Please choose "STUDY" or "EDUCATION" as the "PURPOSE OF VISIT"
3.	PLEASE DO NOT THROW AWAY OR LOSE your immigration form – within 2 days after arrival you should pass them to the Migration Department of FinU and show your valid passport there. This will serve as your temporarily registration in Moscow.
4.	If you want to travel to other cities during your study period in Moscow (St.Petersburg, the Golden Ring towns, wherever), you must once again come to Migration Office at FinU for extending your registration in first 2 days after coming back to Moscow!
5.	Not extending your registration for study purposes after checking in hotels in other cities may lead to fines and fees at the passport control at departure!
6.	To secure your legal immigration status we recommend having your Immigration Card with you all the time.

The useful hint here is to provide your FinU International Team Coordinator with scanned copy of your visa – this can be helpful in case of any emergency, like – oops, having your passport lost, or forgotten in your room while you may need to present it somewhere (ticket offices, hotels, intercity railway stations, airports, etc.)



Migration Registration

Upon Arrival

Please e-mail the following documents to FinU Migration Office ovu@fa.ru:

Scanned copy or photo of your Immigration Form you filled in upon arrival

Scanned copy of all passport pages with issued visas, any marks and stamps

Please note: If sending a photo, be sure that all the text is readable, and the picture quality is fine. It is better to send the documents in a single e-mail with the subject indicating your name and "Migration Registration" as a topic.

Please visit the Migration Office 45 days prior to the expiry date of your current registration period in case you have not left the territory of the **Russian Federation**



Extending your Visa

As you may remember, the Study Visa is issued for 90 days only. To extend your stay in Russia officially for longer period please contact the Migration Office and e-mail them to <u>ovu@fa.ru</u> the following documents:

Getting to FinU

AeroExpress train is the best way to get from Airport to Moscow. A fast speed train that provides rail passenger transportation services, covering routes between Moscow and airports of the Moscow Air Cluster (Vnukovo, Domodedovo, and Sheremetyevo). We recommend flying to Sheremetyevo International Airport (SVO) when you arrive in Russia since it is the nearest one to FinU Main Campus.

AeroExpress + Metro ticket: 1 single journey in a standard class carriage strictly in accordance with the date and route specified on the ticket and selected upon purchase and 1 journey on public transport (metro/bus/trolleybus/tram) within 5 days, including the date of purchase. Cost: from 399 ₽.

Buddy programme (UniFriend)

A current FinU student will be your buddy and will meet you at the metro station upon your arrival. He/she will help you with all the details: meet & greet, assistance with checking into a residence, applying for a migration card, assistance in submitting documents for a student card and university campus tour.

Most students receive their buddy's contact information 2 weeks before the program start date. As soon as you receive this information, contact your buddy to introduce yourself and to share your flight details. This is very important, so that you can arrange for pick-up in central Moscow. When your buddy meets you at the metro station, they will generally hold up a sign with your name on it. If you have shared photos, you might recognize one another.

If your flight is delayed, you should call your buddy or leave a message. All Moscow Airports have free Wifi if you need to contact your buddy.



FinU Main Campus

Our University Main Campus includes five buildings, you will need to recognize

Building 49

Here you can find the International Office, the library, our University Council Hall, some Faculties, ATMs and the Museum of Finance.

Building 51

Here we have our Hall with a capacity up to 1200, the digital library, auditoriums and different catering facilities. By the way, some of your classes will be held here.

and

Building 55

Besides other facilities, it homes the Dormitory. Other buildings house administrative and academic departments, such as HR, media laboratories or cafés.



Financial University Campus is located in just a few steps from the Metro station 'AEROPORT' (emerald green line 2), the walk from the station to dormitory will take less than 10 min. Metro is the fastest and most popular public transport.

How to get accommodated at FinU Dormitory

All exchange students are provided with the room in FinU Dormitory. To confirm the accommodation please e-mail to your FinU coordinator. By arrival you will need to present the following documents:

original passport and its copy

2 photos, 3x4 cm

medical insurance for the whole period of stay in the Russian Federation

official medical certificate confirming you have no AIDS or HIV (the certificate should be translated into Russian and notarized!)

general medical certificate including your current health status, vaccine record, fluorographic and dermatologist review (the certificate should be translated into Russian and notarized!)

dormitory accommodation application form

Accommodation cost in 2200 RUB per month, please contact your coordinator to get updates if there are cost changes. The payment is to be processed with a credit/debit card in the beginning of the month. Payment receipts should be presented to the Dormitory Administrator.

Campus Card & On-Campus Accommodation rules

All FinU students and staff members use Campus Cards to enter the university territory, this helps to maintain security. The card also can be a payment instrument. To get yours please contact your coordinator!

A Campus Card should never be passed to other persons. In case of losing a card please contact your coordinator to get a temporary one.

It is prohibited to provide other persons with your dormitory room. If you want to invite guests please fill in a form to get visitor cards for them.



Smoking and consumption of alcohol are strictly prohibited in FinU.

FinU Facilities

The University Library and Information Complex

The FinU Library houses 851,136 physical volumes, including scientific & teaching literature, literature in foreign languages, a collection of theses defended at the university, a fund of printed periodicals in Russian and foreign languages, a collection of unique rarities (the earliest is dated 1854), a fund of fiction and digital books. 10 libraries are located at FinU campuses, the main ones are at Building 49, Building 51.

FinU Electronic Library

The library information complex is fully equipped with computers, printers, copiers, scanners, RFID. The local area network is integrated into the university communications network, which allows students to work



independently with the on-line information resources in study halls, media libraries and a co-working space. Total number of seats: 591 (34 seats for people with disabilities). Total number of registered readers: 23,428.

Full-text electronic collections are available to FinU users from the media libraries, any computer that is part of the university's local network and has Internet access, as well as remotely 24 hours a day.

Where can I get a library item I need?

Students obtain all the prescribed manuals and textbooks that they need during the semester at the University library. They are available for home use. Other items are only available for home use if there is more than one copy of the items.

How can I use the library items remotely?



In order to get remote access to e-library items, you need to show your campus pass card to the library personnel. A user can obtain a login and a password if he/she abides by the library items use rules.

International Bookcrossing Project

If you bring your book to the bookcrossing project depository at the student residence hall located at Building 55 (5th floor), you can choose a book from the list of available books and take it.

Co-working

FinU co-working space for collaborative innovators in the heart of University. FinU offers flexible days and space for teams of 1-20+. FinU supports students looking to take their idea to impact. Join us for a tour to learn more about our Co-working workspace.

Health and Wellness

FinU sees health and wellness as top priority of life quality. Students can use:

25-meter swimming pool (swimming classes, aqua aerobics)

Light Gym Hall (aerobics, Pilates, yoga, etc.)

4 gyms with various types of equipment

2 rooms equipped for table tennis competitions

professional boxing ring

coaches classes for: volleyball, basketball, futsal, swimming, tennis, table tennis, boxing, recreational gymnastics, martial arts





FinU competitions include: Sports days, Student Futsal Cup, Cross-Country Race, Rector's Cup for Athletics, Chess Tournaments, Student Volley-Ball and Basket-Ball Competitions, Tennis and Arm-Wrestling University Competitions, University Badminton, Streetball and Karting Competitions etc.

Food and Catering Services

There are many dining halls and snack counters on the University premises.

Dining hall: You can have a full-fledged three-course meal.

Snack counter: You can get a bite to eat in here or take-away. Various sandwiches and soft drinks are on offer.

You can choose dishes from the menu

or have a fixed meal in the University dining halls/canteens.

A fixed meal is a three-course meal offered every day. It includes a salad,



a main course, and a drink. Bread is also included. Each day's fixed meal is different. It costs about 300 rubles. Different methods of cooking, incl. frying, stewing, braising and baking, are used to make various types of dishes on offer.

Meals, Catering and Food Expenses

in town

According to official average data, the basic foodstuffs (including bread, pasta, meat, fish, vegetables, fruit, milk, and sugar) cost about 6000 rubles a month (~ USD 85 per month) in Russia.





The average cost of a lunch in a Moscow café/restaurant is 700-2,000 rubles (~ USD 11-30). A business lunch costs 280-500 rubles (~ USD 3.5-7). Fast food prices are a bit lower.

Museum of Finance

FinU Main Campus hosts a unique museum, located in Building 49 (2nd floor). The collection of notes, coins, historical items and antiques is mainly devoted to the centennial of Russian contemporary monetary system, from the turbulent times of the Revolution of 1917 till latest notes emission in 2017. However



today it is beyond the initial framework, you can learn more about money, such a piece of everyday life: which of them were used as wallpapers, what happens to them when they get worn-out, is it possible to maintain an economy without money, and how it is connected with the history of FinU.

Located in the north of Moscow Region in a picturesque forest, with eco-trails for hiking in summer and crosscountry skiing in winter, it has wide range of facilities to create relaxing atmosphere during vacation. 


MOSCOW METRO

We hope that this Handbook is useful for your both studying and leisure time. Just let us remind you about the regulations prescribed by Federal Law:



NO SMOKING!

University is a non-smoking zone. Smoking in halls, auditoriums and dormitory rooms is strictly prohibited. Smoking in cafes, restaurants, parks, playgrounds and public places is subject to fine up to 3000 RUB regardless of citizenship.

NO ALCOHOL!

Consumption of alcohol in public is strictly prohibited by law. Financial University has its own regulations that do not allow alcohol at the territory of the Campus. Hard liquors and other alcohol beverages can be found in restaurants and bars. Please keep in mind that alcohol can not be purchased in shops after 10.00 p.m.!
